

## Burnham 2025 Consumer Confidence Report

### Updated Corrective Action Statements for the Violation Section

#### Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) Availability/Content

##### Corrective Action:

The required Consumer Confidence Report has been completed and updated. Procedures have been strengthened to ensure all future reporting and distribution requirements are completed within the required timeframes.

#### Chlorine Monitoring

##### Corrective Action:

Required monitoring has been completed, and subsequent testing confirmed the drinking water met all applicable state and federal drinking water standards.

#### Haloacetic Acids (HAA5)

##### Corrective Action:

Follow-up monitoring was completed, and analytical results confirmed compliance with applicable drinking water quality standards.

#### Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM)

##### Corrective Action:

Additional sampling confirmed the system remained within regulatory drinking water standards following completion of the required monitoring.

#### Lead and Copper Rule

##### Corrective Action:

All required lead and copper samples were collected, and residents with applicable sampling results were properly notified. The violation was administrative in nature and occurred because the total number of required samples was not completed during the monitoring period. The violation was **not** the result of elevated lead levels or unsafe drinking water.

#### Lead Service Line Notification

##### Corrective Action:

The Village has completed the required notification process and continues to update records in accordance with Illinois EPA Lead Service Line Inventory requirements.

#### Revised Total Coliform Rule (RTCR)

##### Corrective Action:

Required bacteriological monitoring has been completed. Follow-up sampling confirmed the distribution system met applicable drinking water quality standards.

#### General Corrective Action Statement

The Village of Burnham remains committed to providing safe, reliable, and high-quality drinking water. The compliance items identified in this report were primarily related to regulatory monitoring, reporting, or administrative requirements. Where applicable, required sampling has been completed, corrective actions have been implemented, and the Village continues to work closely with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) to maintain full regulatory compliance while protecting public health.
