Vehicle stickers for 2025-2026 available on June 2nd. Your present vehicle sticker EXPIRES JUNE 30, 2025. Please bring in your current State of Illinois vehicle registration when purchasing your Burnham vehicle sticker. All vehicles must have a current 2025-2026 Burnham vehicle sticker properly displayed in the lower passenger side of the vehicle windshield by July 1, 2025.

New Vehicle / New Resident: Shall have a period of time not to exceed 10 (ten) days after purchasing any motor vehicle or coming into possession of a motor vehicle or becoming a resident of the village. Bring in your Bill of Sale and Registration to purchase your Burnham vehicle sticker. If you trade your vehicle, remove your current Village of Burnham sticker, and bring it to Village Hall with your new vehicle registration. No other Village/City sticker is valid.

- YARD WASTE:** Refuse collection day is every Monday. If a holiday falls on a Monday, the collection day will be the next business day. **Yard Waste Season** is April 1st to November 30th. By Illinois state law, yard waste cannot be disposed of with regular garbage. Yard waste will be picked up on regularly scheduled garbage days. Yard waste can be placed in brown paper yard waste bags or in yard waste carts. Yard waste bags and containers cannot exceed 50 pounds and should be able to be reasonably lifted by one person. Bundled and tied branches should be cut to 3-4 foot lengths
- HEAVY PICK UP:** Homewood Disposal Service, Inc. will pick up weekly on Monday; **ONE bulk item each week.** One large item of furniture or one household appliance. **Items that will not be collected: No TVs, engine blocks, tires, transmissions, axles, heavy metal parts, broken concrete, stone, clay, dirt, metal, swimming pools, electronic waste or refuse resulting from building construction or material.** For more information on bulk pickups and fees, contact **Homewood Disposal Residential Dispatch at 708-798-1004 or visit mydisposal.com**
- LEAF COLLECTION:** Leaf collection begins in the fall-as needed. Please rake leaves to the parkway and remove any debris that may cause harm to our workers or damage the equipment.
- UNKEPT PROPERTIES** Please maintain your lawns, parkways, alleys and keep the area behind your garage cut and cleaned. Enforcement Citations will be issued for unkept properties. Please keep grass clippings off the street and away from the curb drains.
- GARBAGE CARTS:** No other containers can be used. Garbage cannot be left on the ground. Enforcement Citations will be issued. Close garbage lids to prevent rainwater collecting which can lead to mosquitoes, and helps prevent animals from getting into the garbage.
- BUILDING PERMITS:** Home improvements, additions or construction require a Building Permit. Applications can be found on the Village website. Unpermitted work will be stopped and citations issued.
- LIBRARY CARDS:** Residents of the town of Burnham may obtain a library card at the Calumet City Public Library. The library will issue the library card to the individual and then directly bill the Village of Burnham for an annual fee of \$100. Burnham residents will be subject to the same rules and regulations regarding application and proof of residence as outlined in Resident Cards. - STREET & ALLEY LIGHTS:** Metal light poles outages – call Village Hall with address/location. Wooden light poles outages - call ComEd 800-334-7661.
- GUTTERS & SUMP PUMPS:** Please direct any water discharged from gutters and sump pumps to your own property. Water from gutters and sump pumps should **not** flow onto Village property.
- PET OWNERS:** As a responsible Pet Owner, clean up after your pet. Pets outside your property should be on a leash. Pet waste endangers the health of our children, transmits disease and devalues our Village. Pet walkers must clean-up their pet’s waste. Signs will be posted throughout the Village. Citations will be issued for non-compliance. All pets require current rabies vaccinations and a Pet Tag.
- CODE RED NOTIFICATION:** The **Code Red** system will alert residents of emergencies and urgent information. Go to our website and click on the link, and follow the instructions to sign up for notifications.
